Harper's Hope

Harper's Hope, a comprehensive cancer survivorship program, offers services to help improve the quality of life for cancer survivors. Made possible through a generous contribution to Methodist Hospital Foundation, Harper's Hope

Cancer Prevention

In collaboration with community partners, we offer a range of cancer screening events to help detect cancers early, share ways to reduce your risk and promote healthy lifestyles. (402) 354-4263

Hereditary Cancer Risk

This program partners with GeneMatters to offer quality and timely genetic counseling and testing with board-certified genetic counselors. These telehealth sessions are designed to help you understand your cancer risk and make the most informed health care decisions possible. (402) 354-5276

Behavioral Health & Psycho-Oncology

This program helps patients and caregivers manage anxiety, sadness and emotional upsets that may accompany a cancer diagnosis. The Behavioral Health team includes clinical social workers and counselors. When appropriate, referrals are available to a psycho-oncologist, a psychiatrist specializing in cancer care. Inner Beauty: A Specialty Salon for Cancer Survivors

Patients have the opportunity to consult with a clinical cosmetologist and/or certified mastectomy fitter as part of this medically based appearance program. During the consultation, a comprehensive and individualized appearance plan is created that may include specialty products like makeup, wigs and hats, as well as post-mastectomy bras and breast prosthesis. Oncology Nutrition Services

Consultations with Methodist Estabrook Cancer Center's oncology registered dietitians are available. The dietitian can provide eating tips, share recipes and make supplement suggestions for anyone suffering from cancer. (402) 354-4282

Physical Wellness

This program offers cancer survivors massages and exercise classes, including aerobics, Pilates, yoga and strength training. (Available classes are listed on reverse.) (402) 354-0847

Oncology Social Workers

Oncology social workers are available to patients and caregivers to help address the nonmedical concerns that are often encountered during cancer treatment and in survivorship, including caregiver stress, transportation needs, financial issues, support resources and practical barriers to care.
